



VOTING ON ELECTION DAY

WHEN IS ELECTION DAY?

There will be a statewide primary on August 2, 2022 and a statewide general election on November 8, 2022.

WHERE DO I VOTE ON ELECTION DAY?

If you are already registered to vote where you live, you must vote at your assigned polling place. You can find your polling place online at the Michigan Voter Information Center michigan.gov/vote (click on “your voter information”), on your Voter Identification Card, by calling your city or township clerk, or by calling the nonpartisan Election Protection hotline (866-OUR-VOTE).

If you are not registered to vote where you live, you must visit your city or township clerk’s office with proof of residency by 8 p.m. on Election Day (August 2 for the primary and November 8 for the general election) to register to vote. Once you are registered, you can vote by absentee ballot in the clerk’s office or go to your polling place, if there is time to do so.

WHEN ARE THE POLLS OPEN?

Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. local time on Election Day (August 2 for the primary and November 8 for the general election). You have the right to vote if you are in line by 8 p.m.

WHAT WILL BE ON THE BALLOT?

If you are registered to vote, you can view your sample ballot at the Michigan Voter Information Center michigan.gov/vote by entering the required information.

WHAT IF I HAVE A PROBLEM VOTING, OR SOMEONE IS TRYING TO INTIMIDATE OR HARASS ME?

Tell a poll worker immediately. If the poll worker is the problem, or they don’t address the problem, call your city or township clerk. If the city or township clerk doesn’t address the problem, call the nonpartisan Election Protection hotline (866-OUR-VOTE).
